## Principles

3. **Prevention of Pollution** – Squamish Terminals is committed to the prevention of pollution. We will minimize harmful releases to the air, water or land and continue to find ways to reduce our impact on the environment.
4. **Energy & Natural Resources** – Squamish Terminals is committed to strive to use energy and natural resources in an efficient manner, including reduce, re-use and recycle whenever possible.
5. **Communications** – Squamish Terminals will communicate its Environmental Policy to its employees, customers, partners and suppliers.

## Environmental Management System – Scope

The scope of the EMS includes:

- all procedures and activities carried out within the boundaries of the SQT site, including the water lots
- all services related to all commodities including:
  - receiving, storage, delivery and stevedoring
- maintenance and repairs carried out on site by employees and contractors
- administration, information systems, accounting staff and managers
- visitors and contractors on the site

The EMS is designed to manage environmental aspects that Squamish Terminals can control or directly influence. Examples of environmental aspects that are not controlled or directly influenced by Squamish Terminals include, but are not limited to, the following:

- movement, berthing and emissions of vessels and barges
- movement of rail cars by CN Rail or trucks by various hauliers

Squamish Terminals will continuously seek opportunities to improve our adherence to these principles and will periodically report progress to our stakeholders. A sound Environmental Policy and Environmental Management System benefits our employees, customers, partners and suppliers by contributing to the overall well-being and economic health of the community we serve.
